




Primary schools

Primary school education starts at the age of 6. Primary school is divided into two stages.

- First stage lasts for four years (1st 4th year of study).
- Second stage lasts for five years (5th 9th year of study).

After primary school children continue their study at secondary school after passing the entrance exam.

Primary education in Slovakia lasts for nine years and is compulsory.



Secondary Schools

After primary school graduation students continue their study at secondary schools. They are accepted on the base of study results or entrance exams. There are a few types of secondary schools in Slovakia.

1. Grammar schools, High School (Gymnazium): 4-8 years; provide general secondary education and prepare for further study at universities and other higher education institutions.

2. Special Secondary Schools: 4-5 years; are specialized in building, chemistry, engineering, business, agriculture, tourism, hotels, nursing schools, medicine, music and art, drama etc.; they provide specialized education and usually prepare students for further study at higher education institutions.

Secondary school education usually lasts for *four years* though there are schools that provide *five-year* education e.g. **Hotel Academy**.

Secondary education is finished with a school-leaving (maturita) exams, after passing them,

the graduates receive the School-Leaving Certificate.

3. Vocational Schools: 2, 3 or 4 years; prepare students for careers that are based in manual or practical occupations.

Four-year study finishes with school leaving examination.

After graduation at the four-year study students (including Hotel academy) obtain

maturita certificate and a skill (apprenticeship) certificate.

Study at the **three-year** vocational schools finishes by final examination and students get **a skill certificate**.

Based on study results students can continue their study at two-year vocational school (or evening classes) to complete their secondary study with school leaving examination called maturita.

Vocational professions include professions such as builder. mechanic. cook. waiter, hairdresser, baker, butcher, etc.





Universities

After secondary school graduation students can apply for a university study. To enter a university, students have to pass an entrance exam. Students are chosen based on the secondary study results and entrance exam results.

Full university education in Slovakia lasts **five year**, some faculties are organized in **6 year study**, e.g. human medicine (MUDr.). University study in Slovakia is organized in the following stages.

Stage one, bachelor study lasts 3-4 years and graduates obtain Bachelor title (abb. Bc.). Stage two usually lasts 2 years and graduates obtain the following titles:

- Master (abb. Mgr.)
- Engineer (abb. Ing.)
- Doctor title (MUDr., MVDr., MDDr.)

The university title is obtained after writing a diploma work and passing state exam on a promotion ceremony. Most professions require second stage university degree.

Stage three is called doctorant study and last 3-4 years. Graduates obtain a tile PhD which

is placed after the name.

Organization of the school year; schooling/classes; timetable/class schedule

Students go to school five days a week, from Monday until Friday. **Summer holiday** is from the 1st of July until the 31st of August. There is a few days holiday around Christmas and Easter, and on public holidays.

A school year at Slovakia primary and secondary schools consists of two terms. The first term starts on **2nd September** and ends at the end of January, the second term starts on 1st February and lasts until 30th June. Students in Slovakia usually have from 4 to 8 classes a day depending on year of study and school type. **Classes** last for 45 **minutes** and there are 5-15 min. breaks between them. There is a longer break called "big break" when students usually have a snack/lunch. Primary and secondary education in Slovakia is free. Most textbooks and instructional material are distributed for free, returned at the end of the school year.

Students receive marks from 1 to 5, 1 is the best, 5 is the worst. They receive school reports

at the end of each school term.






The System of Education in the U.S.A.
